#### **Public Meeting for Tocsin Project**

Lewis Brown - The comments made tonight will be sent to SRF to help us obtain grant dollars for the project.

**Ryan Lefield** - The state is pushing to clean up off-site sewage discharge in small towns. We're finding high E-coli counts in the water. With grant money, we hope to maintain the rate at \$95/month. A lot of homes in Tocsin will be on a gravity system. Along the force main along SR 224, the homes will have grinder pumps. You will be asked to sign an easement for the RSD to install the grinder pit and have access to for future service calls. Lewis will work with you as to where you want your grinder pit located. This project will be approximately \$4.5 million and we should know by July where we stand with SRF. We'll bid the job this fall pending financing approval from SRF. This will put the project start date in the spring of 2025.

**Mark Burry** - The law has changed regarding easements. The first project in Wells County was the Murray & Liberty Center project, followed by Craigville, and then Kingsland. SRF looks at three components:

- 1. Treatment Costs
- 2. Debt Service
- 3. Operating Costs

We had to delay the Tocsin project for 2 years because SRF made cuts in their available funding. If we get the funding, the board will send out letters of notice to connect if you are within 300 feet of the sewer line. There is a process to exempt your property if your on-site septic system is 20 years old or newer. You've got 60 days to file for an exemption after the notice to connect goes out. The Homeowner is responsible to connect from your home to the system via a lateral sewer line. The RSD will be responsible for the grinder pump.

**Lewis Brown** - The big thing we need from the homeowner is the easement that we need in order to maintain and service the grinder pump.

Terry Kahn - Do you run the line to the road?

Molly Hoag - What happens if we don't get the funding?

Answer (Ryan Lefield) - The project will probably get delayed again.

Public Question - Is there financial help for the low income?

**Answer (Leon)** - There is a form that the township trustees have for the low income people to apply through. It will only cover connection costs.

Public Question - What happens if our systems fail before the project is complete?

Answer (Lewis) - You would have to go on pump & haul. We will have interim rates to cover up front costs of the RSD prior to project completion.
